FIRST ASSOCIATION MEETING HUGE SUCCESS:

Our first meeting of the 3 Lakes Development Association was held on July 10, 1971, at the French Club. FIRST BEAR SEASON THIS YEAR:

PLEASE NOTE: No hunting or taking of bear within a quarter mile of a municipal dump. Use all firearms with care!!
